

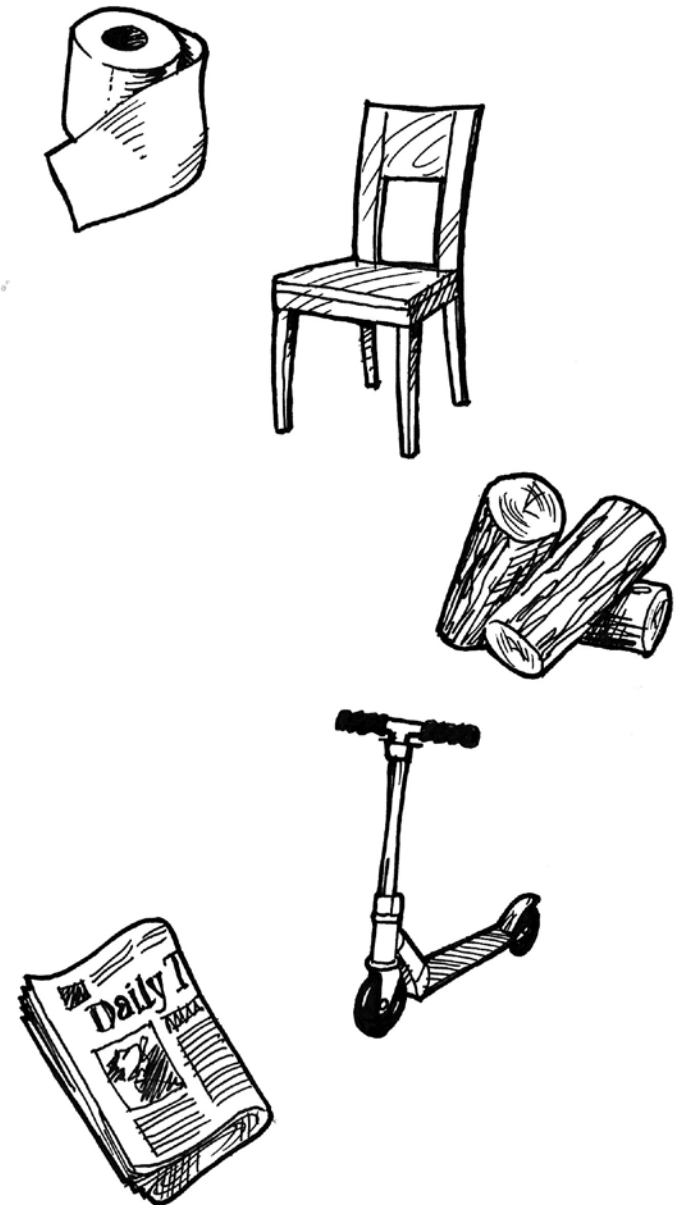
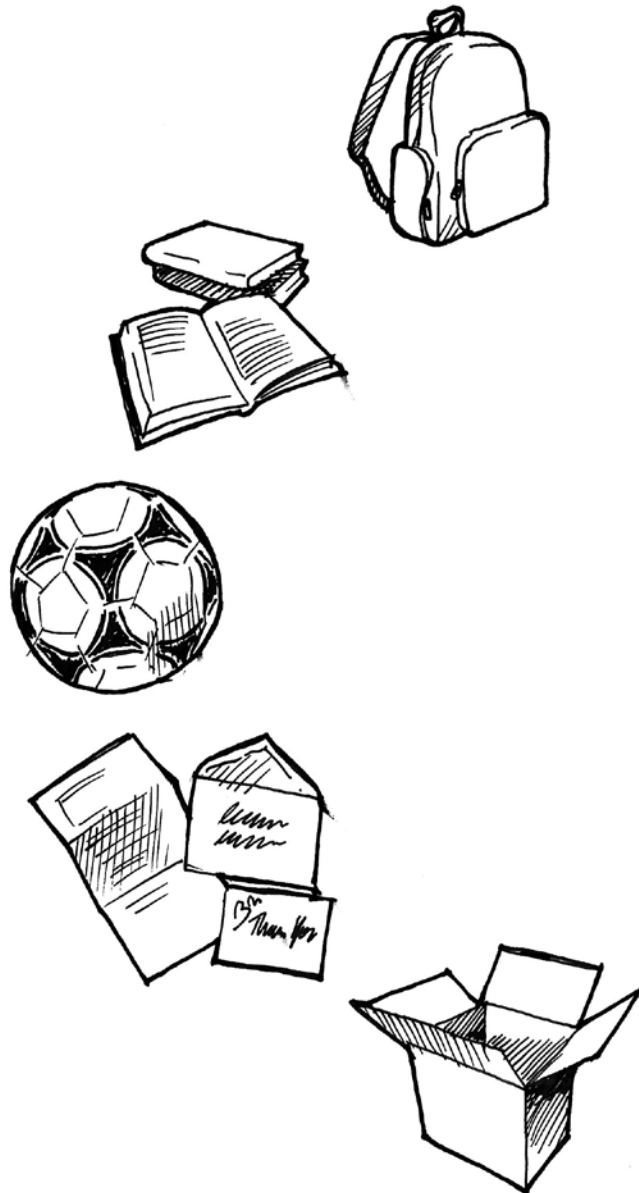

Paper in school: circle all the things that are made from paper in this classroom



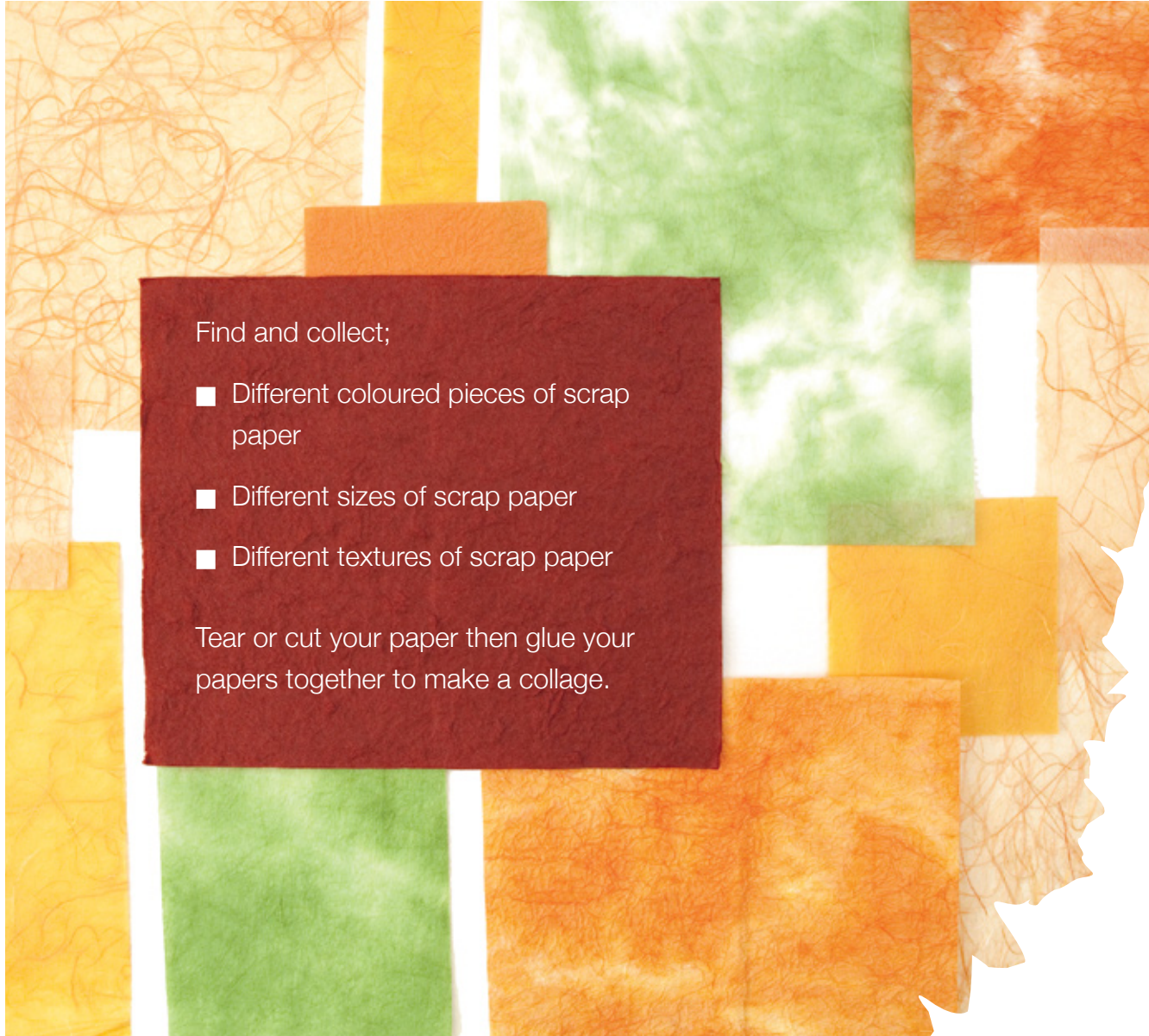
How many items did you find? Up to 10 average, 11 to 15 good, 16 to 20 excellent.

Decorate a large flat cardboard box to use as a paper saver to take home.

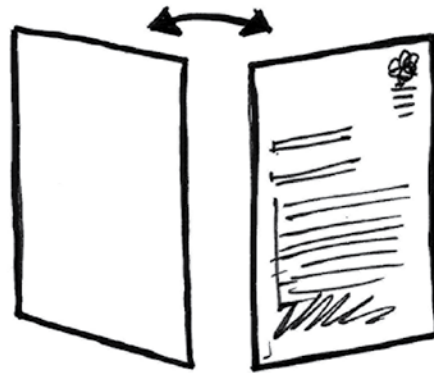


Tell others

Prepare a play, poem or song about using less paper to tell others, where paper comes from and how important it is not to waste paper so we can help protect trees.

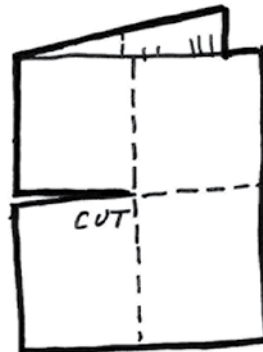
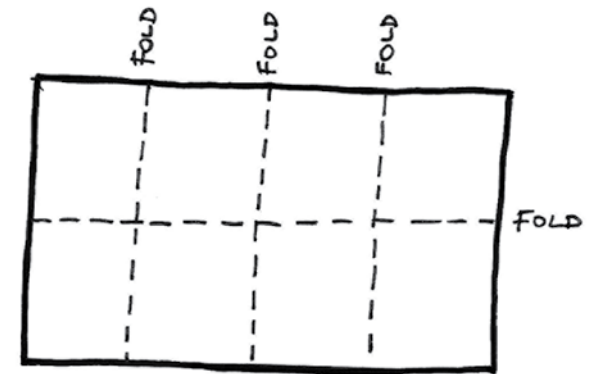
Make your own mini-book

Use a sheet of paper that is already used on one side. Fold in half, then in half again then in half again until your paper has been folded into 8 sections. Cut a slit along the centre, and then fold long ways opening up the centre pages to make a mini 8 page booklet. Fold the paper so that the used side is on the inside. You can draw or write your own stories to make your own little books (see diagram opposite).

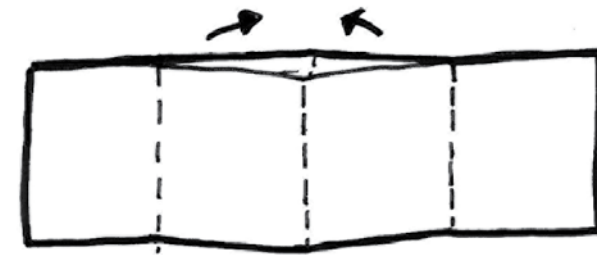


- 1** Use a sheet of paper that is already used on one side.

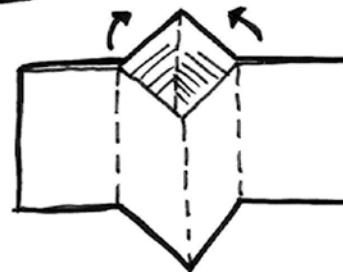
- 2** Fold in half, then in half again then in half again until your paper has been folded in 8 sections.



- 3** Open the paper then fold in half. Cut a slit half way along the centre as shown.



- 4** Fold the paper in half length ways keeping the used side of the paper on the inside.



- 5** Push the centre section outwards until you have four pages. Fold the pages flat and you have your own mini-book.
